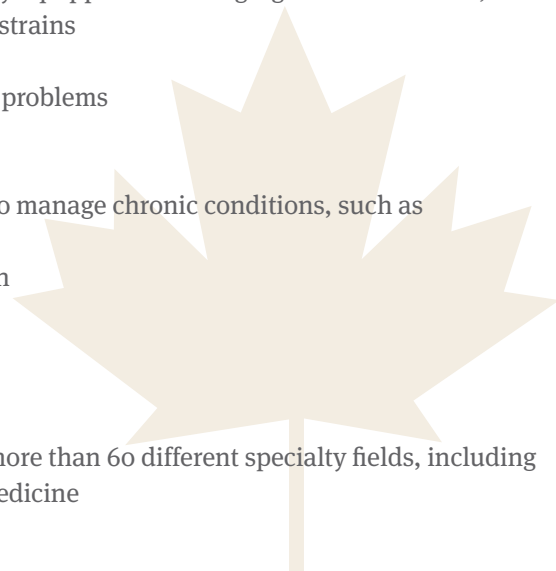


EXPLORE THE PROFITABILITY WITH PAs



- PAs are licensed health care professionals that practice in all 50 states; Washington, D.C.; and the majority of U.S. territories.
- PAs see approximately an average of 84.3 patients per week.
- The average PA prescribes approximately 54 prescriptions a week.
- PAs are especially equipped for managing acute conditions, such as
 - Sprains and strains
 - Bronchitis
 - Gynecologic problems
 - Traumas
- PAs are trained to manage chronic conditions, such as
 - Diabetes
 - Hypertension
 - Depression
 - Asthma
 - Allergies
- PAs practice in more than 60 different specialty fields, including
 - Addiction medicine
 - Primary care
 - Pediatrics
 - Surgery
 - Cardiology
 - Obstetrics
 - Gynecology
 - Dermatology
 - Emergency medicine
- PAs work in a variety of clinical settings, such as
 - Satellite clinics
 - Hospitals
